

**WELLBEING COMMITTEE MEETING OF
HALE PARISH COUNCIL**

HELD AT 4.30PM ON 9th DAY OF JULY 2019 IN HALE VILLAGE HALL, HIGH STREET, HALE VILLAGE, HALTON, CHESHIRE, L24 4AE.

1. APOLOGIES

None.

2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

None.

3. MINUTES

The minutes of the last meeting were signed as a true and accurate record.

4. PUBLIC FORUM

No members of the public wished to speak.

5. FEEDBACK

The Committee noted the positive feedback from residents since the completion of the flowerbed on the corner of High St and Hale Rd.

6. THANKS FOR DONATIONS

Thanks were noted to Dobbies and Halton Borough Council for supplying bedding plants.

7. ADDITIONAL BORDER WORK

The Committee discussed the importance of signage for future works, and resolved to purchase two 600mmx450mm R3A reflective street signs at a cost of £61.20ea and two traffic sign frames (600mmx450mm) at a cost of £10.95ea.

The Committee considered the length of time it took to complete the border on High St and Hale Rd which took considerable digging over and cutting back. Whilst volunteers worked hard, it was noted that a lot of work was involved when tackling areas that had become so overgrown over such a prolonged period of time.



The Committee discussed using further resources from the budget and resolved to engage Scott Harris to assist with the transformation at a rate of £9.00 per hour.

It was agreed a schedule should be worked towards so work would be completed within 2-3 months, and Scott Harris would carry out the below work:

Hale Rd / High St – twelve hours to be spent completing this border.

Aran Close – seven hours to be spent on each of the four borders on Aran Close. A total of 28 hours.

Borders to Shops - fourteen hours to be spent on this border.

Church End – fourteen hours to be spent on each of these two borders. A total of 28 hours.

The Committee resolved all of the above works (a total of 82 paid hours) would be completed to transform these borders.

The Committee also agreed a further 58 paid hours for assistance with maintenance once the borders were completed.

It was therefore agreed that a total of 140 paid hours at a total cost of £1,260.00 would be spent to transform and maintain the overgrown borders. Halton Borough Council would once again be asked to provide further bedding plants.
